# Understanding the Cinematographers role: Meet Nicklas!

Welcome to the world of cinematic storytelling, where the Director of Photography (DoP) plays a multifaceted role, spanning from pre-production to post production. In this PDF, I'll break down the DoP's role into key stages, sharing real-life examples from my own two decades experience as a Swedish Cinematographer.

With a diverse background in photography, drama, storytelling and documentary film, I now focus primarily on fiction, shooting across the globe.

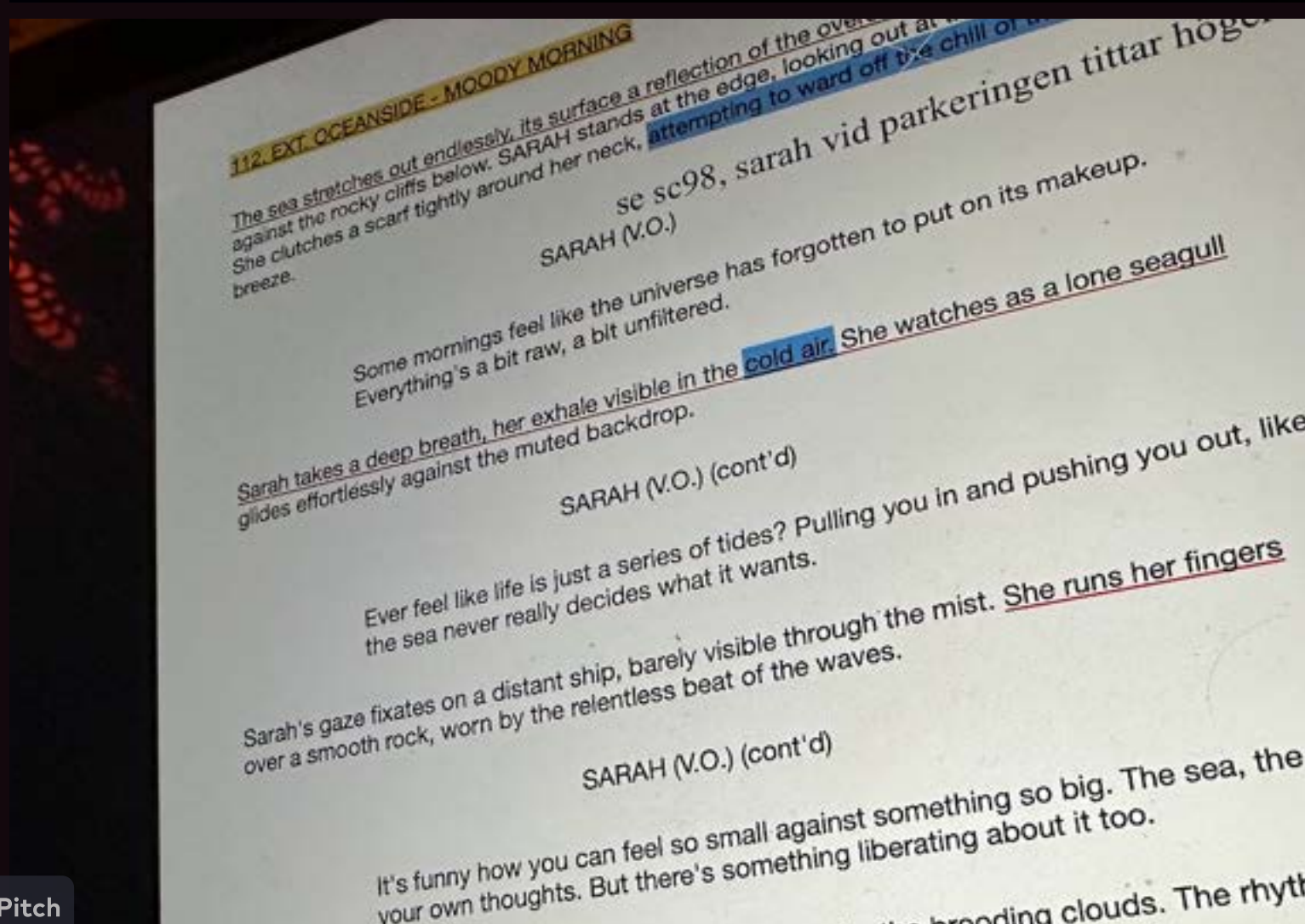
# 1: The Pre-production Phase

## Breaking Down the Script

In pre-production, a DoP's journey begins with script analysis. Together with the director, we meticulously break down the script into visual storytelling elements, setting the stage for every scene. This is where we translate words into images and concepts into compositions as the first draft of a shot list.

## Collaboration with Art Director

We collaborate closely with the art director to discuss all in-camera elements, ensuring that sets, props, and set decoration harmonize with the visual narrative.







### **Extensive Location Reconnaissance**

Prior to filming, we embark on extensive location scouting trips to identify the perfect settings that align with the director's vision.

*On the top picture, we are on a recce in Babylon, Iraq for a feature film, Ibrahim's Journey. Here, we shot a pilot with local team of film crew scouting for suitable background that also has to be production friendly.*

### **Technical Reconnaissance with Lighting Team**

We conduct technical reconnaissance with the lighting team, ensuring the lighting design aligns with the visual narrative. This process includes specifying preferred shooting times, preparation requirements, and equipment and power needs for each setup.

### **Comprehensive Camera Crew Collaboration**

Our collaboration with the camera crew goes beyond camera and lens testing. We discuss specific needs, such as the use of extra cameras or grip equipment for unique setups. As their immediate point of contact, I facilitate seamless communication and relay their requirements.

### **Test Shoots**

Test shooting locations, costumes, and actors is a vital part of pre-production. It allows us to fine-tune camera and lighting techniques and ensure that every detail aligns with the script's visual requirements.



# Working closely

## Shared vision

Aligning with directors to achieve the desired visual style and storytelling and translating the directives to your camera and lighting crew.

## 2: The Shooting Phase - Captaining the Cinematic Ship

The shooting phase is where a DoP assumes a pivotal leadership role, guiding a dedicated team of camera operators, lighting experts and grip crew. It's more than just overseeing; it's about steering a ship of expertise where each crew member plays a crucial role.

### **Crafting Visual Magic in Real-Time**

During this phase, my role evolves into a captain of visual storytelling. I work closely with camera operators to bring the director's vision to life through camera angles, movements, and framing. This is where the cinematic magic happens in real-time. *Top pic, shooting in Babylon, Iraq and below, drama series shoot on a remote island of Sweden.*





### **Synchronising Lighting and Atmosphere**

Collaboration with lighting experts becomes even more vital. We work together to craft the perfect visual atmosphere, manipulating light to evoke the desired mood and emotion in each scene. *Pic. Discussions on forehand with the Gaffer ensures that we are on track to start shoot in time.*

### **Empowering the Grip Crew**

The grip crew ensures that camera movement and stabilization are flawless. I work hand-in-hand with this crew, ensuring that each shot is visually stunning and technically perfect.

### **Immediate Point of Contact**

As the DoP, I am not just the visionary behind the lens but also the immediate point of contact for the entire team. Effective communication is the keystone in ensuring that each shot aligns seamlessly with the director's vision.

Navigating equipment limitations while preserving artistic vision.

# 3: Post-Production - Shaping the Final Vision

## The Color Grading Process

A DoP's role doesn't end after the final shot. In post-production, we continue to shape the visual narrative through color grading. This process fine-tunes the colors, moods, and atmospheres to ensure the film's visual consistency.

*Top pic: In the grading suit you learn a lot on your mistakes from set.*



## VFX and Visual Enhancement

In post-production, we collaborate with visual effects (VFX) teams to create moments of magic on screen. Whether it's enhancing scenes or adding surreal elements, a DoP's influence extends into the realm of visual effects. Pic: Green or Bluescreen are still common ways to replace

background. Today, I would also discuss with production on going into a Virtual Production studio with LED panels or projector screens.
